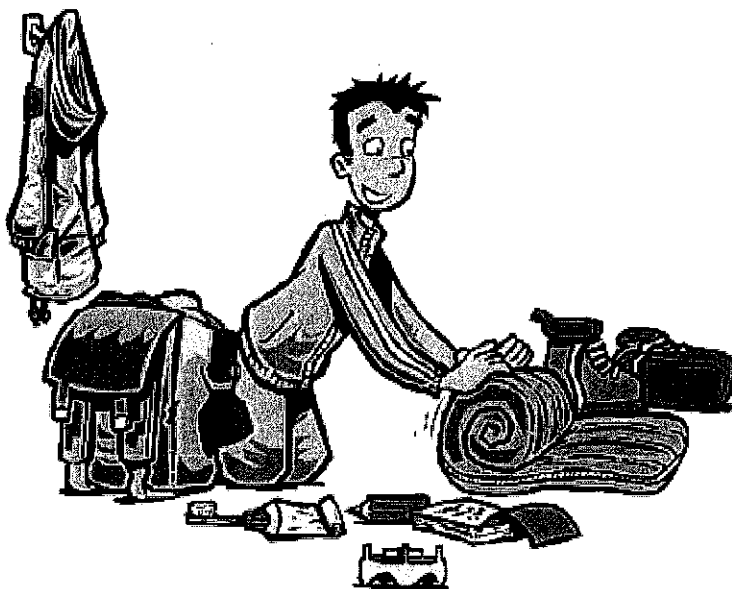

Day Pack

PLEASE PACK THESE ITEMS IN A SMALL DAY PACK. THESE ITEMS WILL BE NEEDED THE FIRST DAY UNTIL ACCESS TO YOUR MAIN LUGGAGE IN THE AFTERNOON AND WILL TAKEN WITH YOU ON ALL EXCURSIONS AND TOURS.

Main Luggage

YOUR MAIN LUGGAGE WILL NOT BE ACCESSIBLE UNTIL YOU ARRIVE AT CAMP IN THE AFTERNOON.

- ◇ SUFFICIENT CLOTHING FOR DURATION OF STAY
- ◇ BEDDING – SLEEPING BAG OR BLANKET, SHEETS AND PILLOW
- ◇ TOWEL FOR SHOWERING & BEACH TOWEL
- ◇ WET WEATHER GEAR
- ◇ CUTLERY AND CROCKERY– PLATE, CUP, BOWL, SPOON, KNIFE AND FORK AND A BAG TO CARRY IT ALL.
- ◇ TEA TOWEL
- ◇ INSECT REPELLENT
- ◇ TORCH AND SPARE BATTERIES
- ◇ TOILETRIES – SOAP, TOOTHPASTE, TOOTHBRUSH, SHAMPOO, BRUSH, DEODERANT
- ◇ CLOTHING SUITABLE FOR BEACH ACTIVITIES (1 PAIR PER DAY)
- ◇ WARM PAIR OF CLOTHES FOR EVENINGS
- ◇ PYJAMAS
- ◇ THONGS AND SHOES
- ◇ PLASTIC BAG FOR WET/DIRTY CLOTHES AND A FEW CLOTHES PEGS
- ◇ *If you are participating in snorkeling as an additional activity full gear is included when visiting the wrecks.
- ◇ SNORKEL SET OR SWIM GOGGLES– ALSO USED FOR SAND TOBOGANNING

Schools

PLEASE ENSURE ALL ITEMS BROUGHT TO CAMP ARE CLEARLY MARKED WITH THE INDIVIDUALS NAME SO THAT WE CAN RETURN LOST ITEMS EASILY. **CARRY ON SIZE LUGGAGE PLEASE - ANY BAGS BIGGER THAN THIS WILL BE CHARGED AN EXTRA FEE DUE TO LIMITED TRAILER SPACE.**

Notes:

- ◇ SCHOOLS SHOULD BRING THEIR OWN SPORTING EQUIPMENT FOR BEACH SPORTS
- ◇ SAND TOBOGANNING BOARDS ARE PROVIDED BY US
- ◇ THE CAMP AND VEHICLES HAVE BASIC FIRST AID KITS. IT IS ADVISABLE FOR SCHOOLS TO HAVE THEIR OWN, PREFERABLY MATCHED TO MEDICAL FORMS.

Your Accommodation Details

You will arrive on the western beach near Tangalooma Wrecks. For larger groups, we take you in 2 groups to Comboyuro Point Campground. This involves one group to walk through the section of beach closed to vehicles in front of Cowan-Cowan. This walk is about 1km, but you will have approx 40mins to walk through. This time will give students an opportunity to view the old WWII relics scattered along the beach and on the foredunes (The 2nd group will do this on the last day). Once at camp, students will be given an orientation and safety briefing about the camp which will detail the following points:

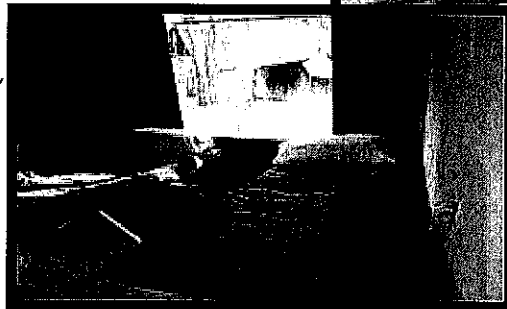
DRINKING WATER – Filtered drinking water will be supplied at all times under the dining area. It is advised that you don't drink water from the taps, this is bore water and has a mineral taste and is a dark amber colour. It is not dangerous, but it may upset weak stomachs due to the tannins in the water.

SHOWERS AND TOILETS – The shower and toilet block is located adjacent to the camp and is a national park facility. Students are asked to minimise their shower times for environmental reasons. The showers are cold water however we provide hot water bush shower bags for those cooler months and for supervisors use.

POWER – 240v power is generated after dark for lighting, recharging supervisors mobile phones and for the operation of AV equipments (if required), but can be turned on anytime if needed. Supervisors will be shown how to operate for emergency situations. A 12v system gives the main area lighting 24hrs

ACCOMMODATION – Students are asked to keep tents clean and tidy. Students are responsible for removing all rubbish from the tents at the end of camp, and giving the floors a sweep. No food or drinks are to be consumed in the tents. Any damages/problems must be reported as soon as possible for repair.

MEAL – Teachers or students will be asked to help serve the meals. Students are required to wash their own cutlery and crockery. Teachers are also asked to organise students groups to clean the dining areas which will include wiping all tables, emptying and wiping out the sinks.



Safety

THERE IS A FULL TIME QLD AMBULANCE STATION AT TANGALOOMA ABOUT 12KMS AWAY. THE CAMP IS LOCATED ABOUT 1KM NORTH OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BULWER WHICH BOASTS A FULLY EQUIPPED FIRST AID STATION AND DEFIBS AT THE GENERAL STORE AND FIRE STATION.

A STATE OF THE ART HELIPAD IS LOCATED ADJACENT TO THE CAMPGROUNDS AS WELL AS A FIRE AND EMERGENCY SUPPORT FACILITY LOCATED IN BULWER. THE FIRE STATION DOUBLES AS AN EMERGENCY SHELTER AREA. EMERGENCIES ARE DEALT WITH BY CAREFLIGHT HELICOPTER SERVICES AS WELL AS AIR SEA RESCUE CRAFT AND COASTGUARD SERVICES AND THE SES ORGANISATION BASED ON THE ISLAND. FOR ANY PROBLEMS DIAL 000.

THE CAMP AND ALL ACTIVITIES COMPLY WITH RELEVANT WORKPLACE HEALTH & SAFETY CRITERIA AND WE OPERATE UNDER A COMMERCIAL TOUR OPERATORS PERMIT ISSUED BY THE QLD GOVERNMENT AND COVERS ALL RELEVANT FEES, CONSENTS AND PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE. ALL VEHICLES OPERATE UNDER A CURRENT OPERATOR ACCREDITATION CERTIFICATE ISSUED BY QLD TRANSPORT COVERING PASSENGER TRANSPORT REGULATIONS. VEHICLES ARE EQUIPPED WITH SEATBELTS, WHICH MUST BE WORN AND ALL CAMP STAFF HOLD BLUE CARD ACCREDITATION AS ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF CHILDREN'S SERVICES.
