

Under this agreement for 2017 Montville State School will receive

\$43,936

This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of Prep students able to read and comprehend short, predictable texts and compose and record short, meaningful sentences from 65% to 85% at the reporting level of 'Working With' or better.
- Every student accessing a different year level curriculum (that is, with an Individual Curriculum Plan) will achieve a 'C' standard or better against the relevant year-level achievement standard.
- Increase the percentage of students achieving a 'B' standard or above in Science from 40% in Year 3 (2015) to 65% in Year 5 (2017).
- Increase the percentage of students achieving a 'B' standard or above in Mathematics from 30% in Year 5 (2016) to 50% in Year 6 (2017).
- Increase the percentage of students achieving a 'B' standard or above in English from 25% in Year 3 (2016) to 50% in Year 4 (2017).

Our initiatives include

- Developing a shared understanding of 'data literacy' and supporting teachers and leadership teams to effectively use data to inform targeted teaching.
- Building teacher capability to use technology to differentiate and improve learning.
- Developing a whole school approach to teaching writing to support the consistent teaching of writing across all learning areas.
- Developing teachers' capability to design and deliver age-appropriate highly individualised curriculum plans to students using the general capabilities of the Australian Curriculum.
- Developing a plan for monitoring early phase Literacy and Numeracy, including the schedule of Early Start assessments, opportunities for professional conversations regarding student progress and strategies for intervention.
